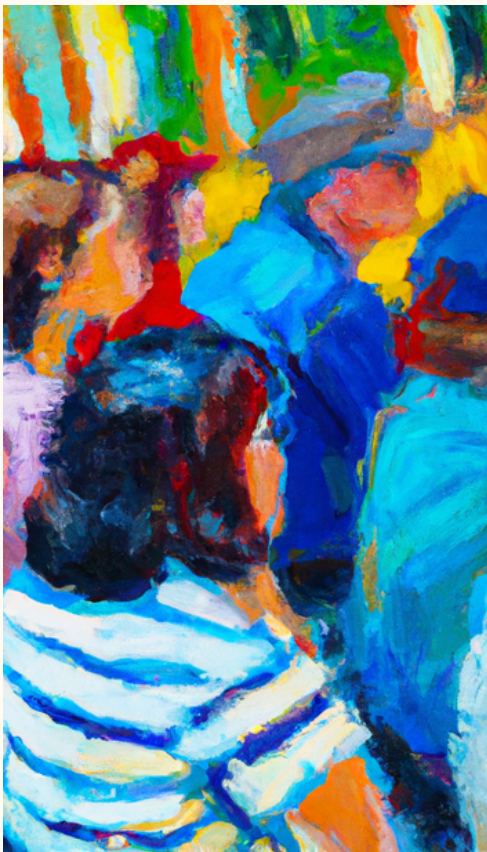

Mutual Mentorship Network

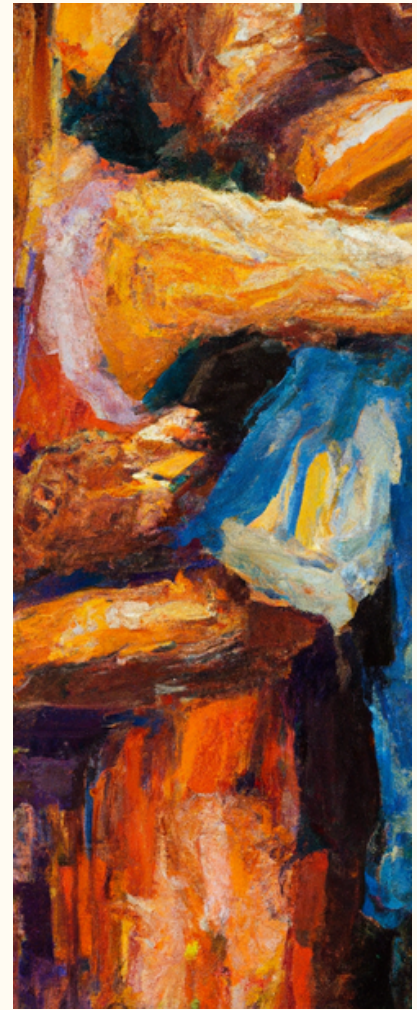
MONDAY WEEK 2,4,6,8 | 11AM-1PM | MERLO UQ
